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Proposed Ontario International Airport South Airport Cargo Center Project Police Questionnaire

1. Please indicate which police station would serve the proposed Project, the station's location, distance to the Project Site, and staffing.

The Ontario Police Department Airport Operations Bureau (AOB). The main substation for the AOB is located at 580 S Vineyard Ave with a K-9 Substation at 1923 E Avion St. The k-9 substation is less than one mile and the AOB substation is less than 4 miles away. The AOB has roving officers who regularly patrol the south side of the airport near and at the project location.

The AOB consists of approximately 40 sworn law enforcement officers.

2. What is the response time to the Project Site? What is the Department's standard for desired response time for emergency and non-emergency calls?

The response time to the project site would vary by type of call and location of officers. In general, emergency calls would have officers at the site within in one to ten minutes. Non-emergency are immediately responded to if there are available officers.

3. Please indicate the type of service calls or service demands anticipated by the proposed Project.

Project sites typically generate service calls for suspicious persons, trespassing, and thefts.

4. Given the existing level of staffing and equipment, will the Police Department be able to provide services to the proposed Project? If not, please indicate what will be required.

The AOB will respond to calls for service requiring a police response. The AOB will not provide a dedicated security.

5. What impact will the proposed Project, in combination with all other projects planned in the area, have on the ability of the Police Department to provide police services in the area?

The proposed project should not affect the ability to provide police services.

6. Do other jurisdictions provide mutual aid? If so, who are they?

The first line of mutual aid will be the Ontario Police Department (OPD) Patrol Division. If further resources are needed, OPD contracts with several surrounding agencies for mutual aid.

7. What mitigation measures, if any, would you recommend for the proposed Project?

Security cameras, alarms systems, adequate lighting, fencing, nighttime security guard.
